

### **Royal Greenwich Trust School**

Welcome to the third edition of our project newsletter. We will keep you informed as to our plans and progress towards the delivery of Royal Greenwich Trust School.



## What has happened?

We are delighted to inform the local community that the first phase of piling works, change over of the mains water supply (from old to new) and the change over of the electrical supply in the newly constructed sub station have all been completed.

The relocation of the site entrance has also been completed in order to allow Greenwich Trust School students and teachers to move into temporary classrooms.







## What happens next?

In the next period (June) we will commence drainage works and ground floor slabs to form the foundations of the new building.

We will also prepare the ground surrounding the building footprint to accept the cranes and concrete pumps for the continuous building of both the steel frame in late July and the future works.

Moreover, it is exciting to highlight that we are expecting a temporary addition to our team in June — a work placement student who will have an opportunity to spend a fortnight at our site and learn from the best. In addition, we have invited Greenwich Trust School students to visit our site and office during their careers week for educational purposes.
